'Young Hearts' celebrate music across the generations

More than 60 singers aged 10 to 90 years young will come together to celebrate music in an intergenerational choir performance in Adelaide's northern suburbs next month.

ACH Group's Sing for Joy choir is teaming up with students from Wynn Vale Primary School to perform a range of songs, including 'Route 66', 'The Rainbow Connection' and 'This is Me', from hit musical The Greatest Showman.

'Young Hearts – a celebration of music across generations' will feature two of ACH Group's four Sing for Joy choirs – Wynn Vale and Campbelltown, at the Golden Grove performance in October.

Choir leader Paul Sinkinson says the concert, in its fourth year, offers many rewards for both the students and choir members.

"In society there is sometimes a perception that the generation gap cannot be bridged, but these two groups break all the stereotypes," he says. "You can see it on the faces of the choir, and the kids – they just love being together and sharing the joy of music."

As part of ZestFest next month, ACH Group is set to host free intergenerational singing workshops in the east (October 10) and north (October 8).

Founded in 2010, ACH Group's Sing for Joy Choir offers opportunities for older people to come together to learn, enjoy singing as part of a group, and contribute to the cultural life of South Australia. Choirs are based at Wynn Vale, Campbelltown, Glenelg and Seaford.
